











Tier 3 Vocabulary

| Deciduous |  | Deciduous means having leaves that drop off each year. |
| Evergreen |  | Evergreen means having green leaves that stay on a plant throughout the year. |
| Bird |  | A two-legged creature with wings, feathers, and a beak is a bird. |
| Reptile |  | An animal that breathes air and has scales is a reptile.. |
| Amphibian |  | An animal that lives in water, then grows legs and lives on land is an amphibian. |
| Fish |  | An animal that lives and breathes in water is a fish. |
| Mammal |  | An animal that feeds its young on its own milk is a mammal. |
| Flower |  | The part of a plant that blossoms and produces seeds is the flower. |
| Plant |  | A living thing, for example, trees, shrubs, herbs and grasses is a plant. |
| Stem |  | The thin, upright part of the plant that leaves grow off. |

We are being scientists by:

- identifying and naming a common wild and garden plants
- identifying and describing the parts of common flowering plants, including trees
- Identifying and naming a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals
- Identifying whether animals are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- asking simple questions and recognising that they can be answered in different ways
- observing closely, using simple equipment like magnifying pots and viewfinders
- performing simple tests and gather and record data to answer questions
- using their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions
