<b>Disciple</b>	Someone who follows the teachings of a leader or a set of ideas.

<b>Follower</b>	To be guided by someone or something
<b>Gospel</b>	Good news
<b>biography</b>	A book that tells someone's life story
<b>leprosy</b>	A contagious disease that affects the skin
<b>leper</b>	A person suffering from leprosy
<b>Community</b>	A group of people who live in the same area or who have something in common with each other
<b>World</b>	the planet Earth
<b>Society</b>	All the people who live in the same country or area and share the same laws and customs
