Religion 	Belief in God or Gods and to practise your beliefs
Faith 	Trust in someone or something
Worship 	To express your love and devotion to God
God 	The being worshiped as the creator and ruler of the universe
Creation 	Something that has been made
Holy 	To do with or belonging to God
Festival 	A time when people celebrate something
Prayer 	To talk to God either out loud or silently

Skills and Understanding

- Ask good questions about how Jewish artefacts are used and their meaning (B1)
- Talk about how the mezuzah in the home reminds Jewish people about God (A3).
- Talk about why Shabbat is a special day of the week for Jewish people (B1)
- Give some examples of what Jewish people might do to celebrate Shabbat (B1).
- Re-tell a story that shows what Jewish people at the festivals of Hanukah might think about God, suggesting what it means (A2).

Key Facts

- The Shabbat is a day to rest and study the Torah.
- Challah is a special bread and it is eaten at special times such as Shabbat.
- Jewish people do not do any work on the Shabbat.
- A mezuzah is fixed to the door of Jewish homes because the Torah says Jewish people must "write the words of God on the gates and doorposts of your house."
- Hanukkah lasts for eight nights, to remember how long the holy light burned. A Menorah is lit each night.
