Allah	The God Muslims believe in.
Holy Qur'an	The holy book.
Mosque	The place where Muslims worship.
Prayer mat	A small rug that Muslims kneel on when they pray
Minaret	A slender tower which is typically part of a mosque.
Dome	A rounded, circular roof or ceiling on a room or Building.
Minbar	Is used by the Imam to speak to the congregation.
Imam	A leader of the mosque or community.
Shahadah	The first pillar of Islam .
Sacred	Something that is shone great respect.
Special	Extraordinary and important
Ramadan	The ninth month of the Muslin year, where fasting is observed from dawn to sunset.
