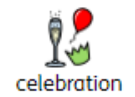
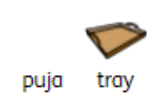


# Easton CE Primary School Knowledge Organiser for Year 3 RWV Term 1: Why do people pray?

<b>Submission</b>	Being obedient and giving in to power or authority
<b>Surah</b>	A chapter in the Qur'an
<b>Holy Qur'an</b>	The holy book of Islam
<b>Al Fatiha</b>	The first chapter (surah) of the Qur'an
<b>Wudu</b>	A ritual of washing to be performed in preparation for prayer and worship.
<b>Symbol</b>	Something that stands for something else
<b>Worship</b>	Respect or admiration
<b>Mosque</b>	A place of worship for Muslims
<b>Bible</b>	The holy book of Christianity

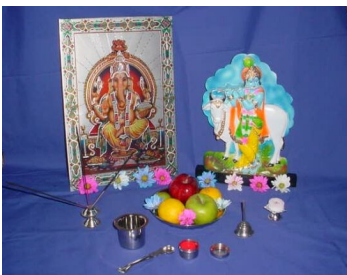
<b>Lord's prayer</b>	A prayer said by Christians
<b>Church</b>	A place of worship for Christians
<b>Shrine</b>	A place where people go to worship because of it's connection to a holy person
<b>Gayatri Mantra</b>	A prayer sung by Hindu's
<b>Puja tray</b>	Holds important items of worship
<b>Celebration</b>	To perform or observe something in a special way
<b>Reflection</b>	To return and reflect on something
