Sacred	Very holy and special
Bible	The Holy Book followed by Christians
Christian	A believer in Jesus Christ and God
Guidance	Advice or information given by someone in authority
New testa-ment	The second part of the Bible about the life and teachings of Jesus Christ
Old testa-ment	The first part of the Bible about the people of Ancient Israel
Verse	A smaller part of a chapter, normally about 1 sentence
Chapter	A division of a book in the Bible
Creation	How the world was made
Fall	When things went wrong, what happened to the world

Incarnation	A new beginning
Salvation	Being saved from sin and its consequences
Praying	To speak to God and the express love or thanks or to ask for something
Temptation	The desire to do or have something which you know you shouldn't
Dishonesty	Being untruthful and deceptive
Respect	A feeling of deep admiration for someone or something
Selfishness	Being concerned with yourself and having no consideration for others

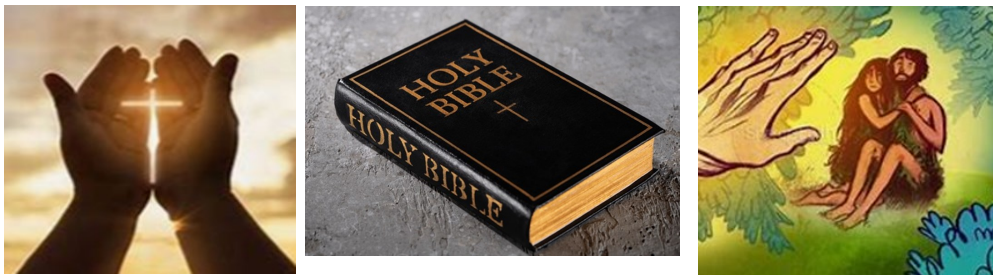
