



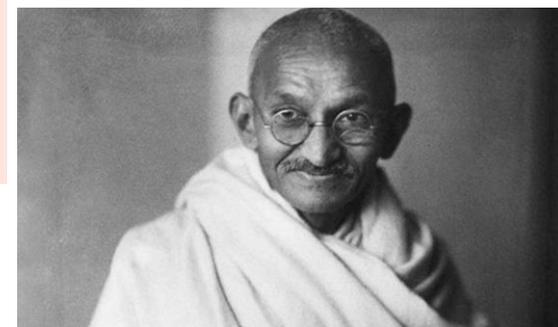
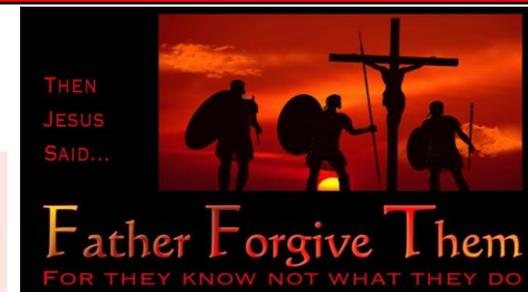
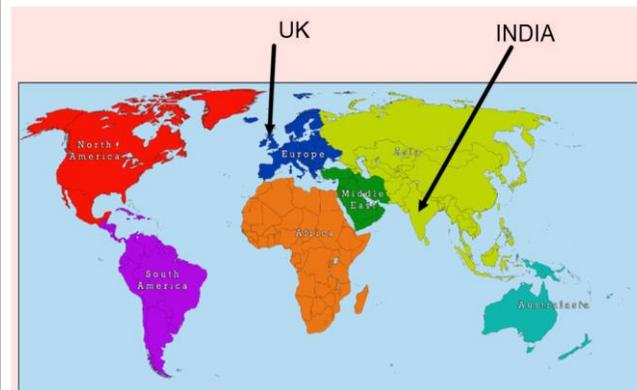
Tier 3 Vocabulary

Ummah:	community
Grace:	generosity of God
Ahimsa:	harmlessness
Commitment:	making a firm, lasting promise
Repent:	saying sorry for wrong choices (sin) and turning toward God to follow Him instead.
Zakat:	one of the 5 pillars of Islam, giving charity to people who are poor or in need.
Qurbani:	the giving of a sacrifice (for example of an animal or of money) to show submission to Allah.
Submission:	accepting the power of something
Sewa:	selfless service. It is the act of helping others without expecting any reward, money, or even a "thank you" in return.
