

### Tier 3 Vocabulary

<b>Resurrection:</b>	Being raised from the dead to new life
<b>Fall:</b>	When Adam and Eve disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden which brought sin into the world
<b>Salvation:</b>	Being rescued from sin or danger
<b>Incarnation:</b>	Most Christians believe Jesus came back to life in human form
<b>Crucifixion:</b>	Dying on a cross
<b>Sacrifice:</b>	When someone gives up something important or valuable to help someone else.
<b>Hope:</b>	When you believe that something good can happen, even if things are difficult right now.
<b>Good Friday:</b>	The day Christians believe Jesus died on a cross
<b>Easter Sunday:</b>	The day Christians believe Jesus resurrected

- Explain the impact of the resurrection for most Christians
- Make connections between eye witness accounts in the Bible
- Explain why the resurrection is a core Christian belief

### Key Facts

- Suggest meanings for the resurrection accounts and compare their ideas with ways most Christians interpret these texts to show awareness of their belief in the resurrection

- Know that belief in Jesus' resurrection confirms to most Christians that Jesus is the incarnate Son of God, but also that death is not the end
- Understand how this belief gives most Christians hope for life with God, starting now and continuing in a new life (heaven)
- Know that Jesus died on the cross on Good Friday and resurrected on Easter Sunday
