

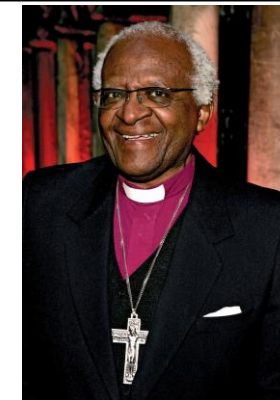
Tier 3 Vocabulary

Rule	<i>A rule is something we are told to follow to help keep things fair and safe.</i>
Neighbour	<i>A neighbour is someone who lives near you.</i>
Commandment	<i>A commandment is a rule that tells people how to behave.</i>
Selfish	<i>Being selfish means only thinking about yourself and not others.</i>
Golden Rule	<i>A moral that says treat others as you would like them to treat you.</i>
Temptation	<i>Temptation is wanting to do something you know you should not do.</i>
Fall	<i>The Fall is the Bible story about when Adam and Eve made a wrong choice.</i>
Disobedient	Not listening to or following the rules
Humanist	<i>A humanist is someone who believes people should be kind and help others.</i>
Beatitudes	<i>The Beatitudes are special teachings from Jesus about how to live kindly and fairly.</i>

Key Facts

- The Golden rule means treating others how you would like to be treated
- The ten commandments guide followers of Christianity and Judasim to make good choices
- Jesus taught Christians a good way to lead their lives using the Beatitudes
- Humanists do not follow a religion and instead use the ten commitments to decide what is right and wrong
- Desmond Tutu is a Christian minister who used peaceful protest to fight against apatheid
